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Survey Methodology Overview

The electronic *Central Minnesota Community Health Survey* of adults was conducted between May and September 2021 in Benton, Sherburne, and Stearns counties.

Survey Instrument

For the 2021 survey, a number of changes were made to the content of a survey conducted in the region in 2016. Staff from each of the participating public health agencies and from CentraCare Health System selected and developed the questions for the 2016 and 2021 survey instruments, with technical assistance from the Minnesota Department of Health Center for Health Statistics. The 2021 survey was formatted by a survey vendor, Survey Systems, Inc. of Shoreview, MN, as a scannable, self-administered English-language questionnaire that was used in the separate, mailed, <u>disproportionate stratified design</u> sample process.

<u>A disproportionate stratified design</u> was employed for the mailed sample. Six sampling strata were defined by county and ZIP code boundaries. Within each stratum, a two-stage sampling strategy was used for obtaining a probability sample of adults. For the first stage of sampling, a random sample of residential addresses within each stratum was purchased from a national sampling vendor (Marketing Systems Group of Horsham, PA).

Address-based sampling was used so that all households would have an equal chance of being sampled for the survey. Marketing Systems Group obtained the list of addresses from the U.S. Postal Service. For the second stage of sampling, the "most recent birthday" method of within-household respondent selection was used to specify one adult from each selected household to complete the survey.

This scannable document was then printed as hard copy surveys and made available for completion. The survey instrument was also translated into Somali and Spanish and built into ArcGIS Survey123 by the Stearns County GIS Department, resulting in a link that could be shared electronically.

Survey Administration

The electronic link to the survey was distributed by public health staff in Benton, Sherburne, and Stearns Counties as well as CentraCare staff via email, social media, newsletters, and websites from May through September 2021. Paid social media ads and boosting was employed. The opportunity to take the survey was shared in meetings at which staff attended. A distribution list was maintained. The paper copies of the scannable document were available for Central Minnesota Alliance staff to use; a handful of paper copies were completed verbally with staff and manually entered by staff into the electronic link.

About the Data Tables

For every table in this data book, results are displayed for sub-groups of respondents based on:

- Gender: male and female
- Age: 18-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64, 65-74, and 75+
- Highest level of education: high school graduate/GED or less, trade or vocational school/some college/Associate degree, bachelor's degree, and graduate or professional degree
- Poverty status: Less than or equal to 200% of poverty level, and more than 200% of poverty level. (example: In 2020, a family of 4 with annual income of \$52,500 = 200% of poverty level)
- The columns in each table correspond to the response options respondents were given on the survey; eachcolumn indicates the percentage of respondents who gave that response to the question. Some questions apply only to certain types of respondents (due to skip patterns in the survey).

Two different types of tables are included in this report:

- Some tables include all response options for a particular question in one table. Each table contains the Region level results, as well as gender, age, education, and poverty status. In addition, each table includes "Local Comparisons" as a quick reference to the other geographic area totals for that question.
- Some tables display results for the sub-questions included in a multi-question. These tables only include aggregate data.

Data in each row is rounded to the nearest tenth of a percentage; therefore, some rows may equal 99% rather than 100%.

Data Suppressed (DS): For statistical validity purposes, data is suppressed when the number of respondents to the question is less than 30. At times, only specific breakdowns in the data tables are suppressed if there are less than 30 respondents from a demographic subgroup (Gender, Age groups, Education, and Poverty status). All suppressed data will be indicated on the table with DS. This assures respondents cannot be identified and the survey remains anonymous.

Collection of Sex, Gender Identity, and Sexual Orientation

To respect the dignity and diversity of our region's residents, for the first time on the Central Minnesota Community Health Survey, an expanded sex (male, female) question was offered by asking "What best describes your gender identity?" and offered six categories and an open-ended text option, and a separate question regarding sexual orientation was added also with six categories and an open-ended text option.

Survey respondents that selected categories of transgender male, transgender female, non-binary, or described their identity via a narrative response, are not represented in the Gender filter of each of the data book pages for this electronic survey data. We acknowledge that this is an imperfect solution. Measurement in survey research faces increasing statistical and ethical challenges as we move toward a more diverse recognition of sex and gender constructs, with no currently recognized single best solution.¹

The survey results by gender identity are included in the Sample Characteristics section of this methodology section. As survey science evolves to fully embrace the complexities of sex and gender characteristics, our hope is that both ethical and statistical solutions for measurement will be developed and universally applied to advance health equity.

About the Survey Methods

- This is primarily an electronic survey. Any paper surveys that were collected, were entered into the electronic link by staff.
- The survey was distributed and available via an electronic link.
- This method produces a final sample that can be attributed to the survey respondents.


